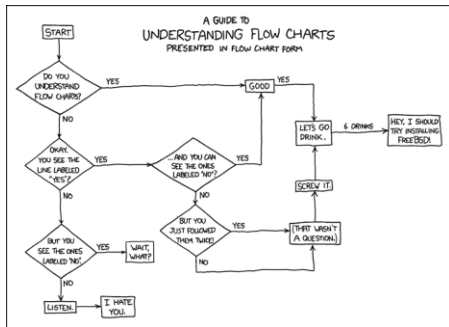


Internet Assigned Numbers Authority

 - RFP expected in mid-October
 - NTIA decision potentially late-December or early-January

- We're setting new performance targets



Alternatively, the **traditional template** can be used and sent through email, post or fax.
